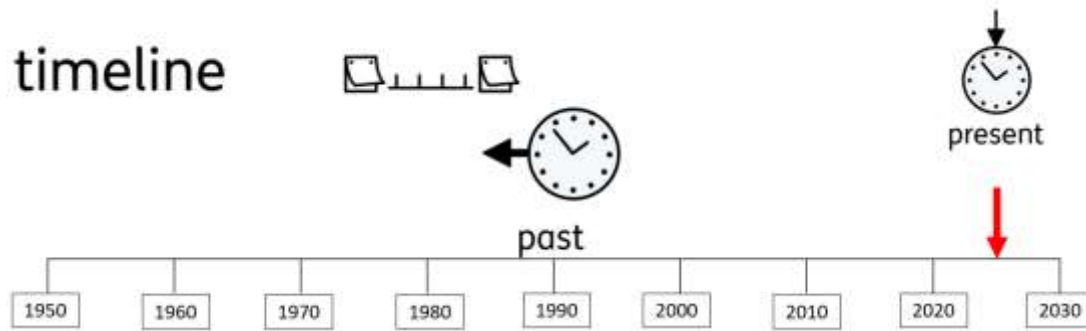


Year 1 - Autumn – What can we learn from older people about how life has changed in living memory?



What I need to know by the end of this unit:

- A questionnaire is a list of questions to collect information.
- Answers can be grouped into similarities and differences.
- Asking good questions helps us to learn more.
- A primary source is something from the past which helps us to learn about it.
- Talking to someone about their life gives us real information about the past.
- Historians look for patterns and changes over time.



Key Vocabulary – Top 5!

- **timeline** – a line that shows when things happened, in the order they happened.
- **past** – everything that has already happened.
- **present** – something that is happening now.
- **living memory** – things that people who are alive can still remember.
- **compare** – to look at two things and see how they are the same or different.
