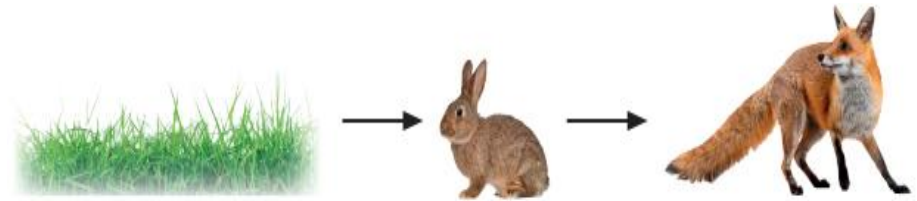


What I need to know by the end of this unit:
