

Glossary:

- Product – something that has been design and made to solve a problem, meet a need, or help someone.
- Embellishment – To add details to make something more attractive, interesting or special.
- Manipulate – to use your hands or actions to change something on purpose
- Applique – layering shapes of fabric onto another fabric by stitching
- Pattern or template – a shape drawn to exact shape and size, used to assist in cutting out.
- Specification – describes what a product has to do.
- Tacking – large running stitches to hold pieces of fabric together temporarily.

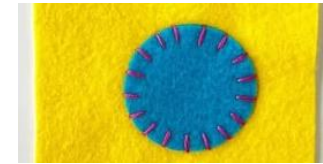
